

EMERGENCY SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE IN PAKISTAN AFFECTED BY THE SEVERE FLOODS

Update for the Entwicklungshilfeklub

Project Title: Pakistan Flood Appeal

Reporting Period: August 2022 - March 2023

Current situation

- 1) According to National Disaster Management Authority more than 33 million persons have been affected by the humanitarian emergency caused by the floods.
 - About 1,739 people have died and almost 8 million people have been displaced.
 - Widespread damage has been reported to critical infrastructure, houses, and livestock



- 2) Oxfam is working in some of the most affected areas: 9,182,616 people have been affected in Baluchistan and 14,563,770 people have been affected in Sindh
 - 90 districts have been affected, 1,739 lives lost, 12,867 people injured, over 2.2 million houses damaged, 4.4 million acres of crop area potentially damaged, 1.1 million livestock perished, 13,115 km of roads and 439 bridges have been damaged.

Oxfam intervention

People reached: The initial target to reach 300,000 beneficences has been met. Through Flood Response a total of **351,497 people have been reached**.

- 24,400 shelter kits
- 12,200 hygiene kits
- 12,200 dignity kits
- 24,400 mosquito nets
- 12,200 jerry buckets
- 720 aqua tabs
- 12,200 Oxfam jerry buckets
- 16,371 winter kits
- 300 Household kits (which include kitchen set, hygiene kit & dignity kit) have been distributed in Sindh & Baluchistan
- Around 4,335 households have received multipurpose cash assistance



Program and project information:

- 100% of winterization kit distributed in Baluchistan & Sindh through partners.
- Sectoral specific training on WASH & FES was provided to partners in Hyderabad, Sindh.

- We have piloted the early recovery response in model villages 05 hand pumps & 04 latrines have been installed in Sanghar & Mirpurkhas, Sindh.
- The multipurpose cash assistance in Sindh is completed. The multipurpose cash assistance in Baluchistan is ongoing.
- Oxfam arranged a dialogue/ brainstorming session with key stakeholders on Advocacy Strategy for Flood Response 2022. The participants included representatives of International and local NGOs such as Save the Children, Muslim Aid, PHF, LHDP, TKF, Care International, mercy Corps, Islamic Relief etc.
- Safeguarding training of Oxfam staff is completed and intermediary partners training is planned
